Appeal health insurance denial through Maryland Insurance Administration

You have the right to appeal a denial by your health insurance company or HMO. If the denial of benefit involves an emergency case, the Maryland Insurance Administration is available **24/7** and can be reached at 800-492-6116. Want more information about how the process works? Spark for Autism

Kennedy Kreiger has partnered with SPARK to create the nation's largest online autism study. The aim is to speed up research and advance our understanding of autism to help improve lives.

- Individuals with autism (including adults), biological parents and siblings are encouraged to participate.
- Registration is easy and can be done entirely online.
- Participants provide a saliva sample using a collection kit shipped to their home, complete surveys, and may be invited to participate in other studies that are relevant to them.
- Participants will receive a gift card code, valued at up to \$50, once they've completed registration and returned samples.

Get your stolen food stamps and welfare (EBT benefits) back!

Over the last several months, more than 2,300 Maryland adults and families with Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) cards have had their food and cash benefits stolen from their accounts. The Maryland Department of Human Services (DHS) is launching a simple, seamless and swift process for reimbursing stolen benefits and getting your money back.

If you or someone you know has been personally affected by stolen EBT benefits, you can now submit a claim for reimbursements. Here's how:

- 1. Click the link to view the EBT Fraud Claim Attestation form
- 2. Complete the form

Medicaid recertifications are coming- make sure your information is up to date!

Do you or a family member currently have health insurance through Medicaid or the Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP)? Changes are coming to Maryland Medicaid! Check in to make sure your contact information—including your mailing address—is up to date so that you can receive important notices on any changes to your health insurance. Medicaid renewals won't be automatic this year so make sure your information is up to date and keep an eye out for mail with further instructions. GRANT OPPORTUNITIES

Baltimore Digital Equity Fund

Has your organization been wanting to work on internet access and digital equity?

The Digital Equity Fund is an initiative to support the creation of community-led digital inclusion plans and provide funding for communities to bring those plans to life. Applications are open from April 10 to June 2, 2023. Grants are tiered from \$5,000-\$75,000.

To help address these gaps, the Digital Equity Fund will provide three types of grants to Baltimore-based nonprofit organizations working in close partnership with communities:

 Education and Outreach grants (\$5,000 - \$10,000) will fund community-based activities to raise awareness of the digital divide, support programming to address the digital divide, and build capacity.

- Planning grants (up to \$50,000) will support community-building efforts to develop neighborhood digital inclusion plans and will also receive funding at two tiers, depending on the scope of the planning grant.
- Implementation grants (up to \$75,000) will support communities in putting digital inclusion plans into action.
