The Baltimore New American Access Coalition

The Baltimore New American Access Coalition (BNAAC) is a group of community organizations [CASA, Esperanza Center, Southeast CDC, Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services(LIRS)], led by MIMA, who are offering public benefit navigation to New American families. Eligible clients can receive help with applying to public benefits, including, health care coverage, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), WIC, cash assistance (TCA), childcare, home energy assistance, Affordable Connectivity Program/internet resources, and more. The BNAAC program has enrolled 312 clients from 23 different Baltimore City zip codes. The program is currently providing benefit navigation support in over 10 languages.

Urban Report finds that Public Charge still impacts Mixed Status Families

The <u>Urban Institute has posted its new (2022 survey data) report on immigrant families' avoidance of</u> <u>safety net programs due to public charge</u>. In spite of having a new Biden public charge rule, the report finds that Trump era policies still impact mixed-status families' use of public benefits.

Recent Investigation by National Public Radio (NPR) shows Failures at Immigrant Detention Facilities

A three-year investigation of immigrant detention facilities shows that <u>"the government's own experts</u> found barbaric treatment, negligent medical and mental health care, racist abuse and what one expert called astonishing failures inside these detention facilities."
